We organize various dressage events and clinics, so everything I have learned here in addition to riding, for example about the stable management and training planning etc., is something we can certainly use further in Hawaii. I have also been incredibly inspired by watching the lessons of others and the clinics with Imke and Tineke. We were allowed to watch all the lessons that were given during those days and also the training of the stable riders. The entire Academy works with so much knowledge, care and love with their horses, you can really see that everything here revolves around the horses. The passion of Tineke and Imke is also admirable and after each lesson I was even more enthusiastic for the next one! The pieces of the puzzle for the rest of my dressage career fell into place here."

During the training week, all participants stay in a hotel room on the Academy grounds.
